Discipline Codes

In your high school handbook, a section is devoted to a discipline code that students are to abide by. Rules and consequences for violating the code are well defined. In most school districts, students are given copies of the code, discuss it during homeroom, and sign a statement that they have *received* the code.

The following are conditional statements from a sample discipline code. Write the converse of each statement. Determine if the conditional statement and the converse are biconditional.

1. If you are late to any class, you will be assigned an office detention.
2. If you are insubordinate to any adult in the building, you will be assigned a Saturday detention.
3. In any computer environment, if you are using unauthorized access to the internet, you will lose computer privileges for one week in all of your classes.
4. If you are involved in a verbal argument with another *student*, you and that student will be required to attend conflict resolution sessions.
5. If you skip a day of school, you will serve three days of ISS (in-school-suspension).
